

## BRIDGE CLIMB SUMMIT - DAY

Monday, 01 April 2019

Climbing the Sydney Harbour Bridge is the ultimate Sydney experience. This climb is perfect if you want more time to soak up the moment, or even if you are a bit nervous and would like more support from the climb leaders. The bridge you will climb is the largest steel arch bridge in the world. You will journey along catwalks, up ladders, and steadily to the summit of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. The trip is 3.5 hours long and 1,332 steps (that's around 500 calories/2100 kilojoules for those tracking.)

Latching on in the Climb Base below the Bradfield Highway, you will walk on catwalks under the road-deck until you reach the South-East Pylon. You might like to visit this stop after your climb, as you will receive a complimentary entry pass to the Pylon Lookout Museum. This Museum contains a large collection of displays that celebrate the construction of the Bridge and shares its challenges. From the Pylon, you will then ascend 4 ladders to the start of the climb of the upper arch, all the while surrounded by the hum and buzz of Sydney's traffic. With the summit in your sights, your journey continues along the Bridge's outer arch on the Opera House side until you hit the top.

Once you have reached the summit of the world famous Sydney Harbour Bridge you will be 134 metres above Sydney Harbour with the city bustling around you. Experience the satisfaction of

conquering the Bridge and take time to catch your breath. You will witness 360 degrees of captivating views. Surrounded by the famous city, the World Heritage listed Sydney Opera House, the harbour and, of course, with the Bridge itself beneath your feet you will not know where to look first. On a good day, you can see for miles. After a summit celebration with your group, and a photo, you cross the Bridge to the Darling Harbour side to make your descent back to the Climb Base.

## FULL DAY HARBOUR AND CITY

Tuesday, 02 April 2019

The European colonisation of Australia began in an area known as The Rocks. It is here you begin your tour, accompanied by your private guide, weaving through the streets while you learn about the discovery of Australia and uncover the lives of the early settlers. Your next stop is the botanical gardens, but not before pausing under the Harbour Bridge for stunning views of the Sydney Opera House at Dawes Point. A perfect spot to take some iconic shots.

Journey through Woolloomooloo and into Kings Cross, before exploring Paddington for morning tea at a quaint local café. Following this, you will make your way through the backstreets of Paddington and into Woollahra. Commence your descent to Double Bay, the Rodeo Drive of Sydney shopping.

The final stop for the morning is Rose Bay. Here you will be boarding your luxury motor 48' cruiser Iluka to spend 4 hours immersing yourself in Sydney's renowned sights. Cruise to the north side of the harbour, past Kirribilli, home to the Prime Minister, and under the Sydney Harbour Bridge. You will pass within meters of the Sydney Opera House with views back to the Harbour Bridge and up to the Eastern Suburbs before heading east to a quiet picturesque bay for a gourmet lunch.

Your meal is an assortment of fresh local seafood, delicious salads and BBQ treats, plus homemade dessert. This is accompanied by a selection of local beverages. After Lunch, you will head back to Rose Bay surrounded by the waterfront properties of Double Bay, Point Piper, and Vaucluse.

The second half of your discovery of Sydney recommences by road as you drive to Vaucluse House, an old 1800's colonial dwelling. Next is Watson's Bay, where you will enjoy dramatic cliff and city views. With ocean views still on the agenda, no trip would be complete without a stop at Australia's most famous beach. At Bondi, you can explore the coast walk, or venture onto the white sands. Following your trip to Bondi, you will be escorted back to your Sydney accommodation.

Next discover the fascinating local heritage of ultra-trendy Potts Point, commonly referred to as the 'Paris' of Sydney. Your final stop is Sydney's hottest new restaurant - Bistro Rex, where you will savour modern French style cuisine in the chic interior space. Bistro Rex features a delicate menu with a French twist, using the finest Australian produce. ## FLINDERS RANGES

Stretching north from Port Augusta into the sun-seared wilderness of South Australia's deserts, the Flinders Ranges and Outback is one of the country's most impressive destinations.

The Flinders Ranges and Outback provides a dramatic departure from the hectic pace of big cities, but it's surprisingly accessible. And once you're there, you'll experience things that make home look boring.

The arid lands feature country-sized salt lakes, ancient seabeds and majestic ranges, places that stay with all who experience their power and solace.

The Ranges themselves – craggy and haunting – are seared into both Aboriginal and European lore. They've been sculpted by millions of years of rain, wind and sun to form a fractured, furrowed landscape of deep valleys and fearsome ridges, covered with casuarinas and cypress pines. Wilpena Pound is one of Australia's most remarkable sights – a giant saucer-like depression with rims rising to 800m.

The natural environment is known for more than beautiful landscapes beneath wide blue skies: the wildlife is highly adapted and

the ancient rocks have yielded fossils of the oldest known forms of primitive life – discoveries that have rewritten the science books.

a deep leather chair surrounded by the warmth of books and a large stone fireplace. Or if the weather is hot, retreat to the stunning pool that overlooks the Arkaba Creek.

## ARKABA

Along with Arkaba's unreal scenery, the experiences are endless. For those inclined, or with more time on their hands, take a day to discover the neighbouring Flinders Ranges National Park. Drive through the likes of Brachina and Bunyerroo Gorges, or a visit to the

old mining town of Blinman. You might like to stop for lunch at an outback pub.

Arkaba is home to an extraordinary variety of birdlife and wildlife. See them bounding across some of the best scenery in Australia. Local animals you will encounter are red and grey kangaroos, euros, yellow-footed rock wallabies, and emus.

All your plans are designed to take in the best of the morning and afternoon light, while the heat of the middle of the day is a perfect time to relax. Chill in the Library, outdoors on the terrace, on the homestead lawns or poolside, with a fine South Australian wine in hand.

With a rich heritage, fantastic scenery, unique wildlife and a world-class food and wine culture, Kangaroo Island offers endless opportunities for exploration. Southern Ocean Lodge delivers you with a complete Kangaroo Island experience with selected guided adventures.

Get ready to explore Kangaroo Island in a stylish and relaxed manner. Tours of the island typically involve taking in the spectacular landscapes and biodiversity of Flinders Chase National Park, exploring Remarkable Rocks and Admirals Arch, or heading to Seal Bay and the site of the third-largest colony of endangered Australian sea lions. To ensure an intimate and personal experience, excursions operate with usually no more than 10 guests per group. Experienced guides offer customised interpretative tours and adventure to suit every interest. Most expeditions are scheduled during off-peak times so you can enjoy an exclusive safari feel to your encounters.

A popular option to start with is the guided cliff-top walk that takes you about 90 minutes and follows a coastal track from the lodge to a rocky outlook, where osprey nest can be spotted from a comfortable distance. For those wanting something a little more challenging, you can go on a hike between 7 and 13 kilometres through terrain that varies from beach to cliffs, to bush and grassland.

Only a few kilometres from the main lodge is Edwards Cottage. Perfect in the late afternoon if you want to meet with the island's namesake. Find a kangaroo, or 200, wandering calmly through the fields, while wine and canapés are served on the verandah of the cottage.

If you are looking to relax, a small sand dune away from the main lodge, you can do just that. Southern Spa is an Australian take on the traditional spa experience. Treatments boast the Australian-made Li'tya product range and start with a smoking ceremony that is a tribute to the Indigenous tradition of cleansing and welcoming. The stunning view from the spa only adds to the experience.





## FULL DAY PRIVATE CHARTER - CUSTOMISED

Monday, 08 April 2019

With your local guide, start your introduction to Island life, where things take time, where drivers wave as they go by, or even stop for a chat. Have a cuppa with some homemade cakes, before taking a walk down a country track through the tall Eucalyptus trees. Koalas might be snoozing overhead, or perhaps waking briefly for a feed. You will journey through some of the Island's best farming country to the north coast and to Stokes Bay, one of the first areas to be settled on the Island.

Take a walk through the bush with your expert guide, exploring a variety of habitat-types. You will discover what makes that noise, whose tracks are those, and who left that little pile there. Look for wallabies that are almost extinct on the mainland, or spot a kangaroo that can only be found on Kangaroo Island, and stumble across a variety of other birds, plants, and animals. Learn about the conservation efforts to help the critically endangered Kangaroo Island glossy black cockatoo.

On your break for lunch enjoy a delicious meal featuring King George Whiting (local sea fish), fresh salads, and fine South Australian wines at a private bush location high in the Cygnet River valley. Known as Ellamatta, this spot is a leading sheep farming property.

At Seal Bay Conservation Park you will walk with your guide among Australian sea lions on the beautiful sandy beach. The sea lions can be found in the deep ocean, coastal waters, the beach, dunes, coastal heath and right up into coastal mallee. You might get to spot pups nursing and playing in the surf, or see old bulls bearing the scars of territorial disputes, all the while hearing about their unique breeding biology.

The remainder of the afternoon is spent exploring more of the south-east region of the Island. You will visit destinations chosen to reflect the seasonal opportunities. At the conclusion of your day you will be returned to your hotel, or the airport — whatever has been arranged to suit your needs.

## ADELAIDE



walks, either alone or accompanied by a naturalist. Understand the sunburned beauty of Lizard Island. A short stroll along the granite crest of Chinaman's Ridge offers sweeping views across Anchor and Watsons Bays. Walk another sandy track, on the western side of the island, to reach the Lizard Island Research Station. Operated by the Australian Museum, the research station offers you an insight into the scientific secrets of coral reefs. If you are after an impressive walk, climb to the 359m summit of the island. The 360-degree panorama has not changed much since James Cook stood there trying to find a route through the maze of reefs in 1770.

Back at the resort you can play tennis, work out in the gym, join yoga at sunset in a beach gazebo, or if pampering is what you need, the Essentia Day Spa awaits.
